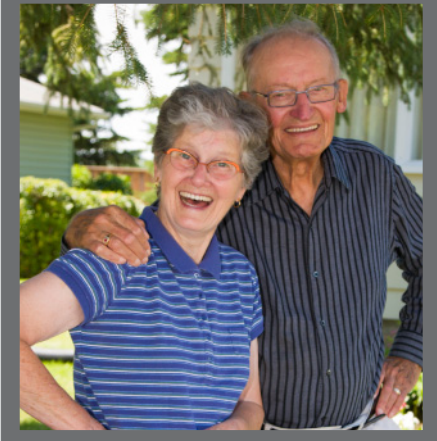

As an Area Agency on Aging (AAA), Generations is part of a national network of more than 655 AAAs across the United States. AAAs were created in 1965 by the Older Americans Act to develop and coordinate community-based programs for older citizens. Generations is one of thirteen Area Agencies serving Iowa's 99 counties.

Generations is your local source for programs, services and information designed to help older adults and their families. Since 1973, Generations has helped thousands of seniors and their caregivers throughout Clinton, Muscatine and Scott Counties in Iowa.

Generations, a community service organization, works with and through other community organizations to administer a wide range of local services for adults age 60 years and better. Generations provides information and assistance in finding services for you or your parent, spouse, relative or friend.

Case Management assists seniors 60 years and better who want to stay and live independently in their homes. Services are coordinated to help with day-to-day living such as transportation to doctor appointments, home delivered meals, housecleaning, nursing services and personal emergency response systems. Many more community-based services are available.

GenAge Cafés serves nutritious and special diet lunch-time meals in either a congregate or home delivered setting. Cafés are located in Clinton, Muscatine and Scott Counties. It's easy to attend and fun, too. Each Café is unique with a variety of fun activities, informational programs and good conversation.

Iowa Family Caregiver Program supports people who are caring for their parent, spouse or relative children. The caregiver specialist is available by phone to provide general caregiving information and helpful resources. Support groups meet monthly, in an informal setting, offering knowledgeable speakers and topics that are geared around the needs of the group. It is also a time to share caregiving challenges and solutions.



Senior Internship Program offers job training and job search help to people 55 and better in Clinton, Muscatine, Scott, Jackson, Louisa, Henry, Des Moines and Lee Counties in Iowa.

Choices Connection, advanced care planning, is a community partnership that provides trained facilitators who can help prepare advance care directives and power of attorney documents.

SMP - Empowering Seniors to Prevent Healthcare Fraud provides information that will help you protect, detect and report Medicare fraud. SMP shares up-to-date information on scams and identify theft schemes through public awareness and small group presentations.
